MISSISSIPPI CHURCH OF GOD PINWOOD DERBY RULES

GENTLEMEN, START YOUR ENGINES!!!

In order to give all of the boys equal initial potential, specific construction guidelines are presented below. Each car must pass inspection by the Official Inspection Committee before competing. The inspectors have the right to disqualify Pinewood Derby cars which do not meet the Racing Specifications.

- The Car:** The car must be built from parts of the "Official Cub Scout Grand Prix Pinewood Derby Kit". This rule will be strictly enforced. The kits are available from any official B.S.A. distributor in your area. Kits from other retailers are not acceptable. Racers must use BSA materials only.
- Width:** Overall width shall not exceed 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ ". The minimum width between the wheels is 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ ". This is to ensure clearance of the lane guides.
- Length:** Overall Length is not to exceed 7 inches.
- Weight:** Total weight is not to exceed 5 ounces. Loose materials of any kind are not permitted in the car. The car may be built up to a maximum weight by the addition of wood and/or metal, provided it is securely attached to the car body. Weights (or coins) held by masking or scotch tape will not hold weights in or on the car for multiple races. If a part of the car falls off during the race, it cannot be replaced.
- Clearance:** Minimum bottom clearance is ". This is to ensure clearance of the lane guides.
- Wheels:** B.S.A. wheels and axles only. Each may be sanded or lathed to reduce friction. However, the tread of the wheels must remain flat. No curving or altering the original composition of the wheels is allowed. The car must be free-wheeling with no starting devices. The car shall not ride on any type of springs. Washers, bushings, all types of wheel bearings and axles other than B.S.A. kit nails are prohibited. Dry powder graphite is allowed as an axle lubricant.
- Detailing:** Details such as steering wheel, driver, windshield, decals, painting, and other interior/exterior detail are allowed as long as they do not cause the car to exceed any of the width, length, weight, or clearance specifications.
- New Car:** Each year of racing requires a newly built car. Previously built Pinewood Derby cars are not acceptable.
- Weigh-ins:** The same weighing device will be used for all cars during the registration. Only two weigh-ins are allowed. Additional rules and regulations may be published and made available up to one month prior to your scheduled race date.

CAMP SITES

Camp Sites will be judged on the following set of rules:

Points can be earned in each of 10 categories:	Great	100 pts
	Good	75 pts
	Fair	50 pts
	Poor	0 pts

- 1. CAMP SITE CLEANLINESS:**
Camp site should be free of all debris, no food left out, neat and organized.
- 2. CAMP SITE LAYOUT:**
Tents should be in a uniform arrangement (straight line, semi-circled, square, etc.), Camp fire should be a safe distance from tents (8-10 ft.). If you build a fire, you must remove the sod and replace the sod at the end of the camp, or build your fire off the ground.
- 3. TENT APPEARANCE:**
Tents should be set up properly. Make sure tents are tight and properly staked down.
- 4. INTERIOR TENT CONDITION:**
Inside of tent WILL BE CHECKED. Leave door flaps open so judges can look in without having to enter tent. Sleeping bags rolled up or laid out neatly (rolled up is best so they don't get walked on), clothes and personal items put away. Be clean and neat.
- 5. CAMP CRAFT:**
Items or equipment built to make camp site more efficient or just to make camp site look better.
- 6. IDENTIFICATION OF CAMP SITE:**
Have some type of sign or banner with name, unit #, etc. Also display your flags.
- 7. CAMP SAFETY:**
Make camp as safe as possible. First aid kit should be visible and easily accessible. Make sure things aren't left where it is easy to trip over. Practice fire safety.
- 8. PIONEER SPIRIT:**
Does your camp site have that rustic look and feel of the true camping spirit, or does it look like the ladies just moved out?
- 9. GENERAL APPEARANCE:**
Overall, how does it look?
- 10. BONUS AWARD:**
Bonus points will be given for things that are very unique or eye-catching.

PINEWOOD DERBY RACE

Guidelines are enclosed for the making of your cars. This is a highlight of the Rendezvous.

ARCHERY

All ages will be able to participate in the archery shooting competition with the camp equipment. **Also, Jr. Centurions and Centurions may bring you own compound bow and field tip arrows for a separate shooting contest.**

RIFLE RANGE

Pellet guns are provided for all ages for the target shooting competition. **Also, Jr. Centurions and Centurions may bring your own pellet gun that shoots .177 caliber pellets for a separate shooting contest. Only single shot guns may be used and no scope allowed. Guns must be presented at registration for official inspection. Pellets will be provided.**

WRIST ROCKETS

There will be a Wrist Rocket (sling shot) competition for all ages.

CASTING

All age groups will have the opportunity to win a free fishing rod during our casting competition.

TOMAHAWK THROW

All age groups will be able to participate in the Tomahawk Throw with a double sided throwing tomahawk. **Also, Jr. Centurions and Centurions will be able to compete in a separate throwing competition with professional throwing tomahawks.**

SWIMMING

The swimming pool will be open, so bring your swim suits. A certified lifeguard will be on duty while the pool is open.

2010 STATE RENDEZVOUS PATCHES

Each person will have the opportunity to earn patches that can only be received at the 2010 Rendezvous.

FREE TIME

You should have plenty of free time with your group. The Rec Center will be open. You may also want to work on individual Gates during your free time.

Rendezvous Awards

COOKING CONTEST

Points will be awarded according to the Cooking Contest sheet. A first and second place trophy will be given and points will be added to your total for the overall award.

CAMP INSPECTION

Each group will be judged on your camp site set up according to the grade scale on the "Camp Sites" form. A first and second place trophy will be given and points will be added to your total for the overall award.

CAMP FORMATION

Points will be awarded for group flag, songs, cheers, and guidon.

PINEWOOD DERBY RACE

First and second place trophies will be given in each age group. Ribbons will be awarded for various areas such as, most original, best paint job, etc.

RIBBONS

Ribbons will be awarded to the first and second place winners in each age group for Archery, Rifle Range, Wrist Rockets, Tomahawk Throw. Points will be award to each church group to go toward your overall total.

CASTING

A fishing rod will be given to each winner in each age group. The runner-up will receive a second place ribbon. Points will be award to each church group to go toward your overall total.

OVERALL WINNER

A first and second place trophy will be award to the two churches that has earned the most points and second most points for the entire weekend. The overall winner will have their church name and year won place on the PFC Rendezvous plaque in the tabernacle. This is the most coveted award, so work hard. This award gives your church bragging rights for the entire year, until the next Rendezvous.
